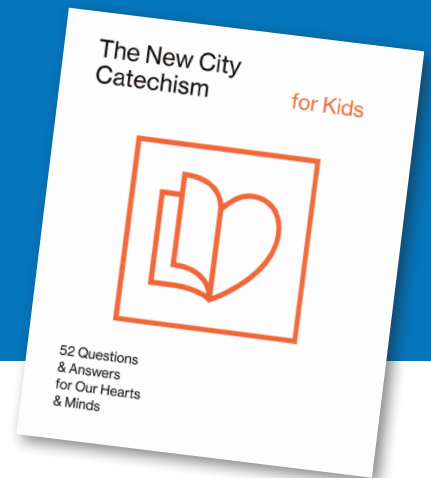




# When it comes to living God's Truth, it's best to know it by heart...



## MEMORIZATION PROJECT | Fall 2019

*"I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." ~ Psalm 119:11*

When it comes to living God's Truth, we believe it's best to know it by heart. That's why we're excited to help kids learn core doctrines of our Christian faith through catechism—using a collection of questions and answers designed for memorization and recitation. These biblical truths will be explored through the lessons from our curriculum: *The New City Catechism*.

Last year we studied Part 1 (Questions 1–20) of the catechism, which covered God, the Creation and the Fall, and the Law. This year we're studying Part 2 (Questions 21–35), which covers Christ, Redemption, and Grace.

**HOW IT WORKS** To encourage the kids to get involved, we're rewarding memorization success and other commendable Christ-like actions with award stickers each week.

Students can earn stickers the following ways:

- Memorizing one verse every week
- Memorizing the Big Idea Truth from the previous lesson
- Completing the Special Memorization Project: The Books of the Bible (Note: One sticker for each genre of scripture: i.e. The Law, History, Poetry & Wisdom, etc.)
- Attending and showing self-control each week
- Bringing a friend

### THE GOAL

Over the next 12 weeks, we've challenged the students to work toward memorization goals based on their age (chart below!). At the end of the semester, we'll honor diligent students who've reached their goal with an award celebration and treats.

<b>WEEK 1</b> Sept. 11	(Kick-Off Week: Welcome to Lost & Found and The Bridge!)	<i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 2</b> Sept. 18 CHRIST	<b>Isaiah 9:6 (ESV)   2 Memory Points</b> “For to us a child is born, to us a son is given... and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.”	<b>Q #21:</b> What sort of Redeemer is needed to bring us back to God? <b>Answer:</b> One who is truly human and also truly God <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 3</b> Sept. 25 CHRIST	<b>Hebrews 2:17 (ESV)   2 Memory Points</b> Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people.	<b>Q #22:</b> Why must the Redeemer be truly human? <b>Answer:</b> That in human nature he might on our behalf perfectly obey the whole law and suffer the punishment for human sin; and also that he might sympathize with our weaknesses. <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 4</b> Oct. 2 CHRIST	<b>Acts 2:24 (ESV)</b> God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it.	<b>Q #23:</b> Why must the Redeemer be truly God? <b>Answer:</b> That because of his divine nature his obedience and suffering would be perfect and effective. <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 5</b> Oct. 9 CHRIST	<b>Colossians 1:21–22 (ESV)   2 Memory Points</b> And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him.	<b>Q #24:</b> Why was it necessary for Christ, the Redeemer, to die? <b>Answer:</b> Christ died willingly in our place to deliver us from the power and penalty of sin and bring us back to God. <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 6</b> Oct. 16 CHRIST	<b>2 Corinthians 5:21 (ESV)</b> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.	<b>Q #25:</b> Does Christ’s death mean all our sins can be forgiven? <b>Answer:</b> Yes, because Christ’s death on the cross fully paid the penalty for our sin, God will remember our sins no more. <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 7</b> Oct. 30	<i>Review...</i>	<i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 8</b> Nov. 6 CHRIST	<b>Colossians 1:19–20 (ESV)</b> For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.	<b>Q #26:</b> What else does Christ’s death redeem? <b>Answer:</b> Every part of fallen creation. <i>Recommended: Books of the Bible</i>
<b>WEEK 9</b> Nov. 13 CHRIST	<b>Romans 5:17 (NLT)   2 Memory Points</b> For the sin of this one man, Adam, caused death to reign.
